

A look back at our key activities over the past year:

In the spring of 2018, Louise Abbott received a joint grant from the Conseil des arts et des lettres du Québec (CALQ) and the MRC Memphremagog to make three short documentaries about three artists living in the Eastern Townships. She has finished shooting the videos and has nearly completed post-production on one of them.

In the summer of 2018, Louise Abbott and Niels Jensen travelled north to Nemaska for the first screening of *Cree Tourism: Creating the Career of Your Dreams*, Rural Route Communication's latest documentary for COTA:
